

HARDSHIP
TRANSFERS

Eligibility for hardship transfers will be based on one or more of the following circumstances:

1. The student wishes to take academic courses needed for graduation and not offered in the district of residence.
2. The student has attended school in the receiving district for at least the two previous years and will be eligible for graduation this school year.
3. The student is under ten years of age, both parents (or one parent in a single parent household) work, and no child-care facility is located within the sending district.
4. The student's health is involved, as certified by a medical doctor, or the student's safety is involved, as certified by the Superintendent of the sending district and the Superintendent of the District. [See FDD]
5. The parent or guardian of the student is employed by the District.
6. The receiving school is more than 20 miles closer to the student's home than the school in the district of residence.

TUITION

For a student with financial hardship, the Superintendent may establish an extended schedule for tuition payments. [See FP]

Tuition will be prorated for students enrolling after the beginning of a semester. Tuition will not be refunded if the District withdraws a student.

NONPAYMENT

The District may initiate withdrawal of a student whose tuition payments are delinquent. When a tuition payment is 30 calendar days late, the District will notify the student's parents by certified mail that the District will initiate withdrawal of the student if payment is not received within ten days of the date the District mails the notice.
