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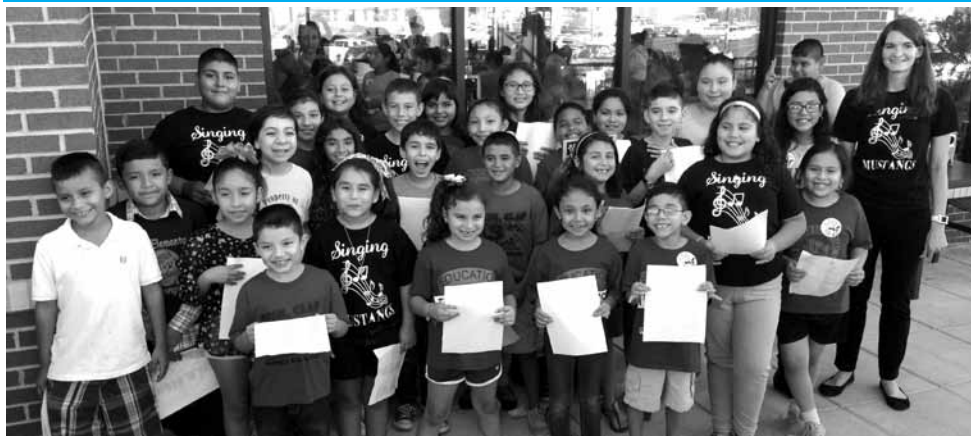

NICK SCOTT, MOTIVATIONAL SPEAKER, AT CARDWELL



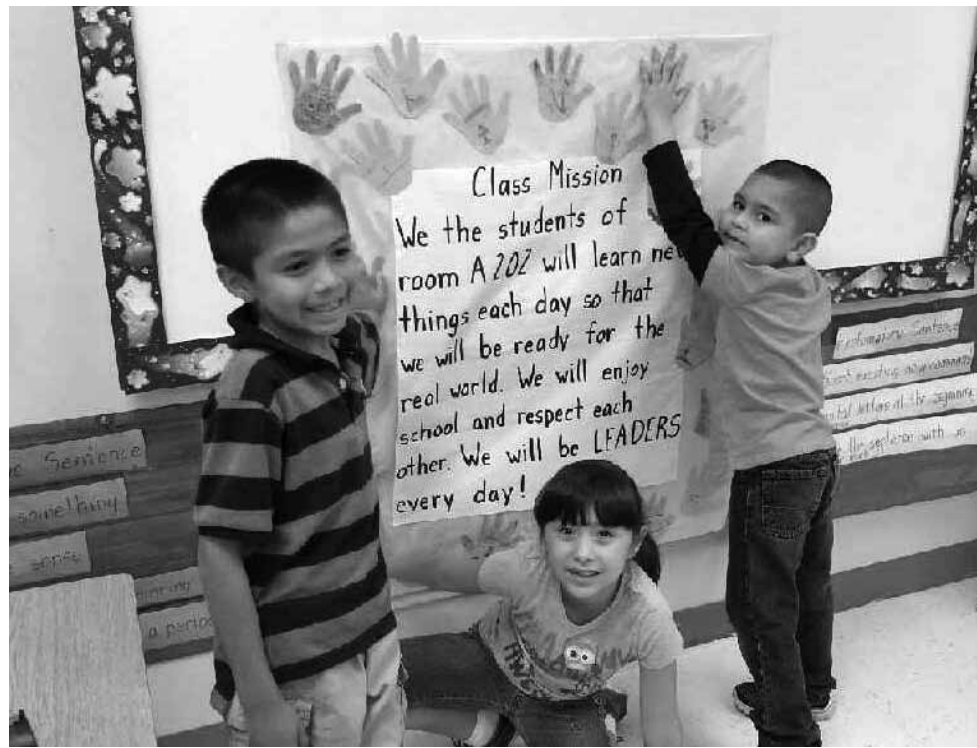

NORTH HEIGHTS COMMUNITY HELPERS WEEK



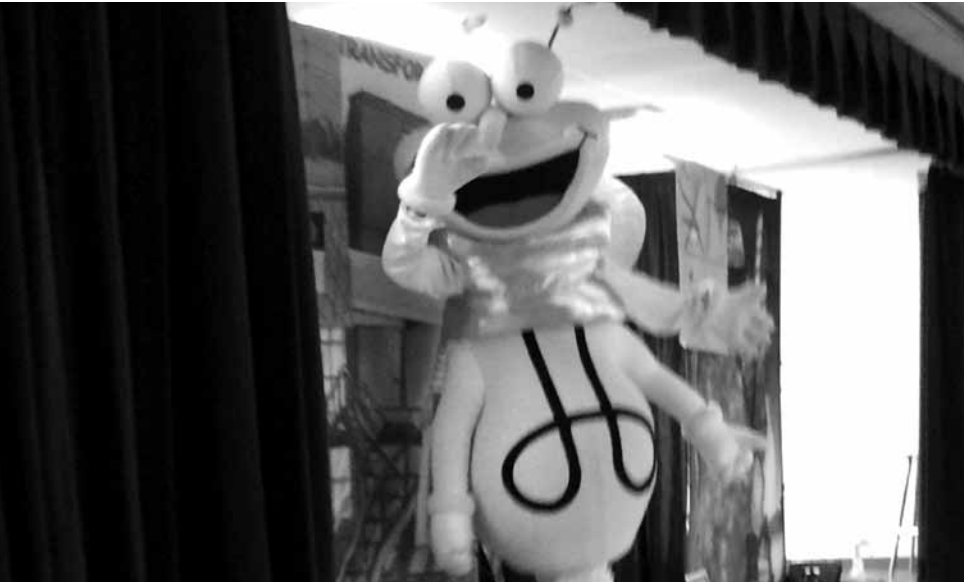
North Heights Elementary kindergarten students celebrated community helpers week October 11 – 16, 2015. Each day a different organization visited with the kinder students about their role as community helpers.

LET THE GAMES BEGIN...



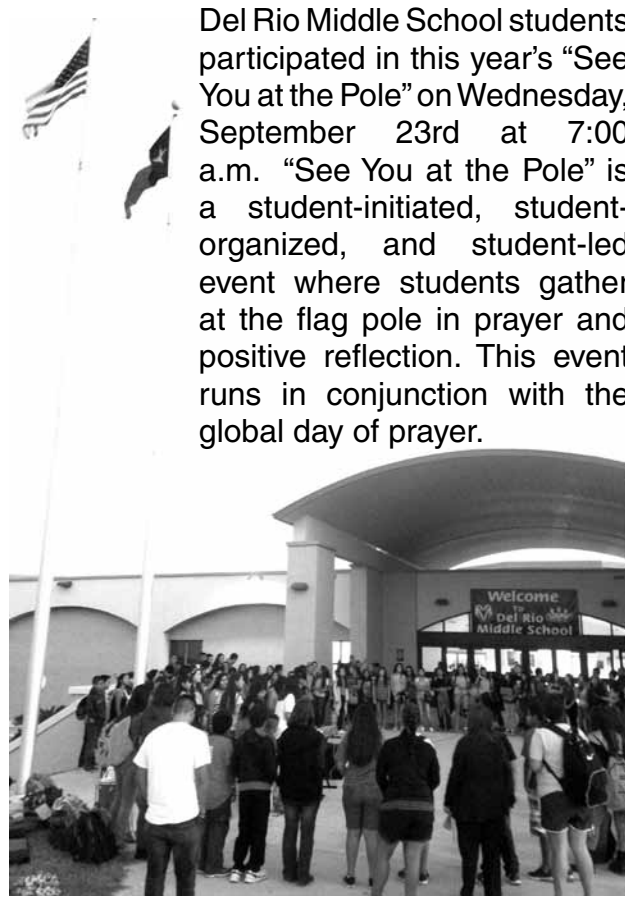

DRHS COUNCIL ATTENDS VOLLEYBALL GAME



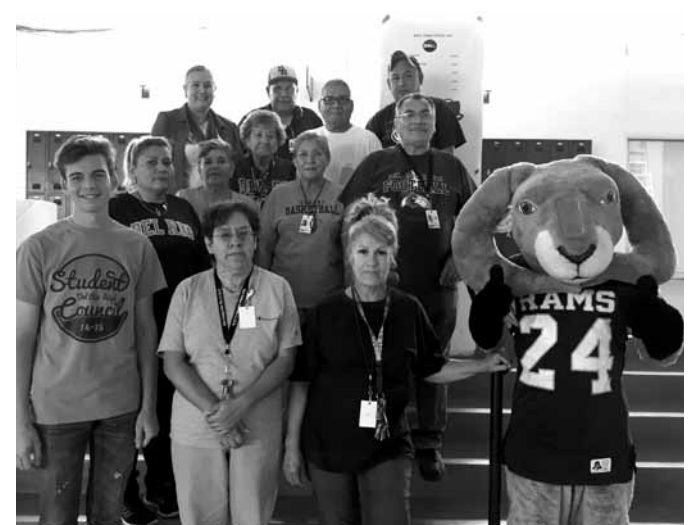
Del Rio High School Student Council was invited to attend the Queens Volleyball game on Tuesday, October 6th in appreciation for their artwork promoting the sport.
