SFDRICISD Prepares to Deploy “Project Safe”

As school safety remains a top priority, and our district’s relationship with local law enforcement is important in that endeavor, the San Felipe Del Rio Consolidated Independent School District (SFDRICISD) has extended an invitation to all law enforcement officers and first responders that serve our community to free breakfast, lunch, or coffee at any of our school campuses throughout the 2018-2019 school year. Campuses are ready to deploy this project beginning next week on Tuesday, October 9th.

In a letter sent to local law enforcement agencies, Dr. Carlos Rios, Superintendent of Schools states, “We are fortunate to have a strong and supportive law enforcement community. We hope that this program and invitation will encourage the presence of more officers on our campuses allowing participating officers the opportunity to familiarize themselves with our buildings, staff and students. It is SFDRICISD’s hope that the implementation of Project Safe would not only bolster the relationship between the district and each of our various law enforcement agencies, but also provide families in our community with the assurance that together, collaborating with our local law enforcement we can do more. This program is also a small way of saying “Thank You,” for serving our community on a daily basis.”

Local and regional police, SRO’s, DPS, U.S. Customs and Border Patrol, and other state and federal officers that serve the Del Rio community are highly encouraged to come in uniform and present their badge in the main office of at any of the District’s campuses during breakfast and lunch periods for a free meal. Officers who stop by at other times throughout the day are also welcomed to grab a cup of coffee in the staff lounges and gain free access to the internet.
