SFDR CISD recognized for excellence in risk management

(Austin, Texas) – The San Felipe Del Rio Consolidated Independent School District (ISD) recently received an Excellence Award from the Texas Association of School Boards’ (TASB) Risk Management Fund, along with \$1,000 to be used toward risk management efforts.

San Felipe Del Rio CISD was one of 10 Texas public school districts to receive the award during the TASB Risk Management Fund’s Members’ Conference May 4 in Austin. The district was recognized for its RediMD Telemedicine Program. Since the community is in need of additional family medicine physicians, having access to telemedicine available 24/7 has been of great benefit to district staff. RediMD makes it possible for staff to see a licensed medical professional for most of their primary care needs without leaving work or home, and provides quality primary care medical service with live, face-to-face diagnosis and treatment online.

“Established by the TASB Risk Management Fund board in 2004, this award is a special way of recognizing Fund members who have demonstrated excellence in risk management initiatives, products, or programs. Excellence Award recipients set an example of timely and effective approaches to risk management that we hope other Fund members will emulate,” said Dubravka Romano, TASB associate executive director.

Fund members recognized include: Aquilla, Bonham, Dime Box, Katy, Klein, Manor, Round Rock, Temple and Wylie ISDs and San Felipe Del Rio Consolidated ISD.

The TASB Risk Management Fund is a self-insurance risk pool serving Texas school districts, community colleges, and education service centers. The Fund was created in 1974 and provides auto, liability, property, unemployment and workers’ compensation coverage to more than 1,000 members.

TASB is a voluntary nonprofit association established in 1949 to serve local public school boards. School board members are the largest group of publicly elected officials in the state. The districts they represent serve more than 5.3 million public school students.
