

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD DECLINING  
SENATE BILL 11 (DAILY PRAYER TIME)**

**WHEREAS**, Texas Education Code § 25.082 allows the right to provide a one-minute period of silence each school day following the pledges to the United States and Texas flags, during which each student may reflect, pray, meditate, or engage in other silent activity not likely to interfere with others;

**WHEREAS**, Senate Bill 11 from the 89th Legislative Session adds Texas Education Code section 25.0823, allowing school boards to designate time each school day at every campus for students and employees to pray and read the Bible or other religious texts; and

**WHEREAS**, Senate Bill 11 requires that by March 1, 2026, each district's school board must take a record vote either to establish the daily prayer time and reading of religious texts by adopting this resolution set out in the new statute;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of the San Felipe Del Rio Consolidated Independent School District declines to adopt the Senate Bill 11 policy regarding daily prayer time.
