SFDRCISD Students in possession of a cell phone must comply with the SFDRCISD Cell Phone/Electronic Devices Policy and the SFDRCISD Acceptable Use Aggreement.

All students will be allowed to use their phone during the following non instructional school times:

- Before the first instructional bell rings
- During passing periods
- During the student's assigned lunch
- After the end of school dismissal bell
- During class for instructional purposes with the teacher's permission
- During out-of-town school sponsored events with the sponsors permission.



SEVERE VIOLATIONS

- The use of electronics during testing.
- Academic dishonesty/cheating.
- Using a cell phone to record or videotape is prohibited unless approved for instructional purposes.
- Use of cell phones in restrooms.
- Use of camera/recording features of cell phone and portable digital media devices in restrooms, locker rooms, or for any use constituting an invasion of any person's reasonable expectations of privacy
- Electronic communication that contains profanity, inappropriate content, intimidation or threats to others.
- Sexting, which includes intentionally creating, producing, distributing, presenting, transmitting, posting, exchanging, or possessing, through any media, any photograph or digitalized image or any visual depiction of a person in any condition of nudity, or involved in a sexual act.

Failure to comply with a staff directive to turn in a cell phone will be considered defiance of authority and subject to disciplinary actions (referral, I.S.S., DAEP Placement).

Use of cellphones and electronic devices is a privilege. Students who do not adhere to the policy are subject to the following consequences.

- Level 1 Verbal Warning
- Level 2 3 day confiscation / contract issued
- Level 3 3 day confiscation / consequence issued
- Level 4 6 day confiscation / consequence issued
- Level 5 10 day confiscation / consequence issued
- **Level 6** 1 year confiscation / Cell phone privileges revoked

Note: In limited circumstances and in accordance with law authorized personnel may search a student's device.
