ABOUT ECHS:

- Del Rio Early College High School was established in August 2015.
- The school enrolls students to join a cohort entering they're 9th grade year.
- The school has a primary goal of affording students from underrepresented backgrounds the opportunity to earn an Associate's degree or 60+ hours and a high school diploma simultaneously.
- Students are able to earn college credit at no cost to them or their families through grades 9th -12th.



CONTINUED:

- As a TEA (Texas Education Agency) designated campus, the Del Rio Early College High School recruitment and enrollment processes shall identify, recruit, and enroll the sub-populations of at-risk students, first-generation college goers, and students of low socioeconomic status.
- ECHS campuses are required to recruit students of underrepresented backgrounds in an effort to increase opportunities for post-secondary success; however, we encourage students of all backgrounds to apply.
- The Del Rio Early College High School is made possible through a partnership between San Felipe Del Rio CISD and Southwest Texas Junior College.

CONTINUED:

 ECHS has graduated 2 cohorts: Class of 2019 and Class of 2020 Associates Degrees earned:

-Class of 2019: 62 -Class of 2020: 66

- Del Rio ECHS has earned an overall rating of an "A" on state accountability standards.
- Current student enrollment grades 9th-12th: total 471 students
- 22 fulltime staff and 6 SWTJC adjunct faculty

TSIA 2

- TSIA2 is state assessment that measures a student's college readiness level and placement in enrolling in colleges and universities in Texas.
- The tests help Texas schools determine whether you're ready for college-level courses in the areas of reading, writing, and math.
- ECHS students will have a variety of opportunities to take the TSIA2 throughout the school year and summer and must take advantage of these opportunities.

HOW DO STUDENTS QUALIFY TO TAKE A COLLEGE CLASS?

- Student must pass both the Reading and Writing (ELA-R) portions of the TSIA2 in order to enroll in a college class.
- The Math portion must be passed in order to enroll in a college based math class.
- Students continue to test throughout the school year and during the summer.
- If the student does not pass the TSIA 2 they are not dropped from ECHS. They will continue to take the courses need for the high school diploma.

APPLYING TO ECHS

- Submit an application available digitally both in English and Spanish through: district website, ECHS website, district Facebook page and student school emails.
- Paper applications are also available at the 8th grade counselors office and ECHS office.
- Only 1 application per student is needed.
- Application deadline February 24, 2021.



BLIND LOTTERY SELECTION PROCESS

- 1. All applicant names are printed on an index card. One card per student.
- 2. Index cards are cross-referenced with application list to make sure all names are accounted for.
- 3. Virtual Blind lottery is scheduled for February 25 at 6pm scheduled. Link will be advertised on SFDR-CISD website and social media.
- 4. Before the lottery begins all applicant names will be read aloud before being added into the tumbler.
- 5. 125 Names will be drawn for the New Cohort, as well as a 100 names to be waitlisted.
- 6. All names will be recorded and posted as drawn.
- 7. New Cohort students will be notified to complete required paperwork and accept admission to ECHS.
- 8. If a student selected in the first 125 does not accept admission or fails to complete a required component we will proceed to notify students from the waitlist in the order selected.



ECHS SUMMER BRIDGE PROGRAM

- ALL students are required to attend the Mandatory ECHS Summer Bridge Program in person or virtually.
- Serves as an ECHS orientation, awareness, student academic standards, expectations and team building opportunities.
- Summer Bridge tentative dates: June 14 July 2
- Students attend 1 of the following sessions:
 - -Session 1: 8:00 a.m. 10:00 a.m.
 - -Session 2: 10:00 a.m.- 12:00 noon
 - -Session 3: 1:00 p.m.- 3:00 p.m.
- Student Attendance, participation and commitment are vital throughout the Summer Bridge Program.
- The Summer Bridge is MANDATORY. Absences are not allowed and will lead to being dropped from ECHS.
- When a student is dropped the next student from the waitlist will be notified.
- Students in grades 10th-12th grade must also attend if they are still pending in passing a TSIA assessment.
