Crazy Cool Cookies!

Ingredients: 2/4 cups of flour, 1 teaspoon of baking soda, 1 teaspoon of salt, 2 sticks of unsalted butter, 3/4 cup of granulated sugar, 3/4 cup of brown sugar, 1 teaspoon of vanilla, 2 eggs, 2 cups of chocolate chips, nuts (optional).

Supplies: Electric mixer, big or medium bowl, spoon, cookie tray, parchment paper, a cooling rack, and a cookie scooper (optional).

1. Preheat the oven to 375 Fahrenheit. Add the flour, baking soda, and salt into your big or medium bowl then stir with spoon.
2. Next add the butter, granulated sugar, and brown sugar into the electric mixer then stir on medium speed until well combined.
3. Add the eggs and the vanilla into the electric mixer and stir.
4. Then add the flower mixture into the electric mixer and stir on low speed. Next add the chocolate chips and nuts if you want the nuts and stir on low.
5. Put the parchment paper on the cookie tray and scoop out some cookies onto the tray.
6. Then put them in the oven for 10 minutes takes them out let them cool on a cooling rack.

A deep thinker, Martin helps the 3rd grade Fiction Fandom writing team get good scoops, and get them fast. He is a quick runner, and a soccer pro.




