rocks, hills, bugs

The ducks quack, quack and hum, hum.

Doc Min is on his horse, Won Ton.
Won Ton has on a tan hat!

Dads, moms, and tots have fun pets.
Big kids and pals do as well.
It is fun to see pets in wigs, hats, and bells!

Consonant **s /z/**

has, his, is, pals, bells, dads, moms, kids, as, wigs

Plural **-s**

pets, pups, socks, cats, dots, pals, hats, ducks, bells, dads, moms, tots, kids, wigs

Dad is packing bags.
Pam helps pack the bags.

Dad is backing up the van.
Mom and Pam get in.
Mom, Dad, and Pam will pick up Jan.

Pam and Jan get to nap in the van.
Mom looks at a map to help Dad.

“Here it is!” Dad yells.
He backs in the van.
Jan and Pam run up the hill.
Mom helps Dad get the bags and set up.

Mom sits as Dad naps.
Jan and Pam sit in the sun.

Mom is packing bags.
Dad is picking up.
Pam and Jan help.
The sun sets as they get back in the van.

helps, looks, yells, sits, naps, sets

Inflected Ending -ing

packing, backing, picking

Jeff likes to lick.
Jeff licks his back leg.

Jeff has a cut on his leg.

Deb is at the vet with Jeff.
The vet can help Jeff.
The vet looks at the cut.
The cut is not red. It is not hot.
“The cut here will get well, “ the vet tells Deb.

Jeff is back in his cat bed.
Deb pets Jeff. He likes it.
Jeff hums and hums.
