Wednesday evening we had the opportunity to present to our School Board, for approval, the schematic design of our future CTE Magnet school and the Student Activity Center/Administration Building. The Board's approval provides us the opportunity to move forward with the implementation of the \$25 million construction projects. It is enjoyable to note that sooner than later our high school students will have a state of the art facility to complete their courses related to Project Lead the Way, Welding, Construction, and Automotive Technology. Equally exciting is the renovation of the once Del Rio Middle School. This building will be a future site for all types of student activities, school board meetings and parent engagement activities, as well as house the central administration personnel. Once we complete these projects, we will move to transform the current administration building into an Early College High School. There is complete excitement for the future of education in our community!
