COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Principles of Law, Public Safety, Corrections, & Security

This course introduces students to professions in law enforcement, security, corrections, and fire and emergency management services. Students will examine the roles and responsibilities of police, courts, corrections, private security, and protective agencies of fire and emergency services. The course provides students with an overview of the skills necessary for careers in law enforcement, fire service, security, and corrections.

Federal Law Enforcement & Protective Services

Federal Law Enforcement & Protective Services provides the knowledge and skills necessary to prepare for certification in security services. The course provides an overview of security elements and types of organizations with a focus on security measures used to protect lives, property, and proprietary information.

Law Enforcement | Regular: College Credit: CRIJ 1301 & CJSA 1351 Articulated Credit: CRIJ 1301
Law Enforcement | Dual Credit

This course provides an overview of the history, organization, and functions of local, state, and federal law enforcement. This course includes the role of constitutional law, the United States legal system, criminal law, law enforcement terminology, and the classification and elements of crime.

Law Enforcement II Reg or Dual Credit: College/Articulated Credit: CRIJ 1307 & CJLE 1303

This course provides the knowledge and skills necessary to prepare for a career in law enforcement. This course includes the ethical and legal responsibilities, operation of police and emergency telecommunication equipment, and courtroom testimony.

Correctional Services Dual Credit: CRIJ 2313

Students prepare for certification required for employment as a correctional officer. The student will learn the role and responsibilities of a correctional officer; discuss relevant rules, regulations, and laws; and discuss defensive

Forensic Science: satisfies a Science credit for graduation requirements

"CSI" in the classroom: Through the use of case studies and simulated crime scenes, students will take on various roles as crime scene investigators, scientists, and medical examiners in order to learn how to process crime scenes. Students will solve crimes by questioning and interviewing, collecting, and analyzing evidence such as DNA, fingerprints, blood spatter and ballistics. They will document their findings in lab reports and present them to a student/class jury.
